Program Scholarships

To support leaders whose background and experience reflect their commitment to Seattle University's values, the university offers Leadership Executive MBA students a limited number of scholarships ranging from \$10,000 - \$30,000. Deadlines and Deposits

A deposit is required from admitted students within two weeks of acceptance. Deposit amounts change in relation to the admission deadline. Deposits are applied to the student's first quarter tuition. December 1 - Early Decision: \$3,000 March 1: \$4,000 May 15: \$5,000 *July 15 pending available space; \$5,000 due at time of application *July 15 admissions are made at the discretion of the admission committee and are based on final application reviews in May. To be considered for July 15, all application materials and the \$5000 deposit must be submitted. If the class is full, applications will be waitlisted or reviewed for the next academic year. If the applicant is not accepted, a full refund of the deposit will be sent.
